Board of Education Executive Order The FAIR Education Act February 2, 2012

I. Overview of the FAIR Education Act

The primary function of Sacramento State is to provide a high-quality education that focuses on student learning and career success (Pillar I of Strategic Plan). All students who meet the requirements result in a high-quality education. Inclusive, Respectful (FAIR) Education Act requires that all instructional materials include additional groups. Additional groups include African Americans, Asian Americans, and European Americans. Instructional materials used in the classroom should include the contributions of men and women of color, including African Americans, Asian Americans, and European Americans, and transgender Americans. The FAIR Education Act addresses the expanded curriculum requirements of the FAIR Education Act.
